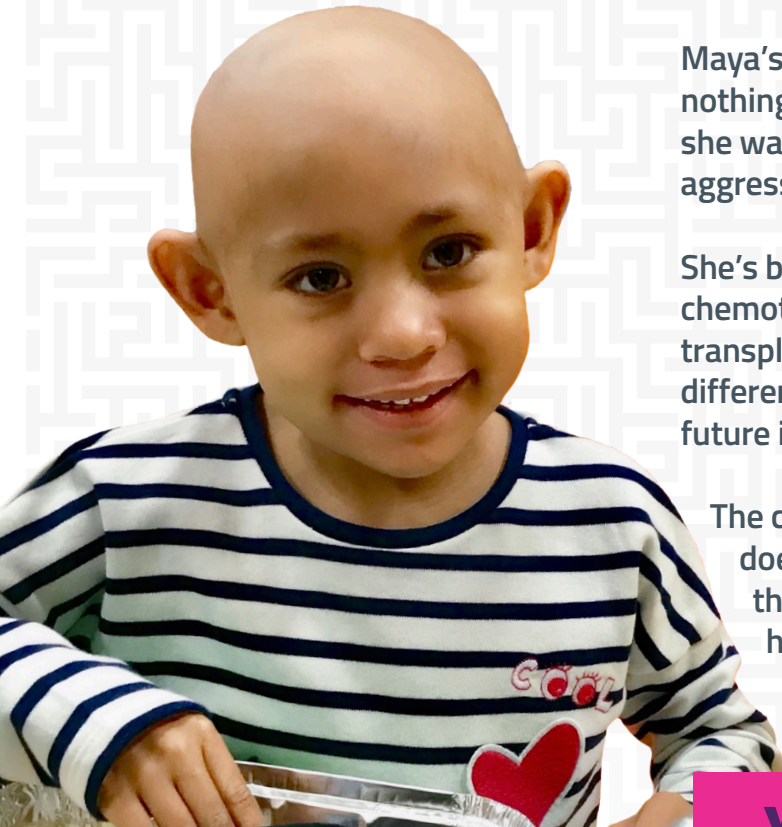


# Urgent appeal to raise £243k for Maya's cancer treatment

Maya's strong, she knows what she wants! She loves nothing more than playing with her baby dolls. But she was diagnosed with high-risk neuroblastoma, an aggressive form of childhood cancer, at just 3 years old.

She's been through an extensive treatment regime - chemotherapy, stem cell harvest, surgery, stem cell transplant, high dose chemotherapy, radiotherapy, differentiation therapy and immunotherapy - but her future is still uncertain.

The cancer comes back almost 50% of the time. If it does the chances of long-term survival drop to less than 10%. So her family are urgently fundraising for her to access the Bivalent Vaccine clinical trial in New York to try to keep her cancer away.

For children with high-risk neuroblastoma, like Maya, the survival rate is much lower than other childhood cancers. If Maya were to relapse, her chance of survival would drop to less than 1 in 10. This is why her family want her to access a treatment that aims to help keep her in remission.
