

Harry is fighting a life-threatening cancer

Little Harry is cheeky and full of mischief. He loves all vehicles, especially 'nee-naws' - ones with a siren!

But this gorgeous boy was diagnosed with high-risk neuroblastoma, an aggressive childhood cancer.

If his cancer came back, Harry would have a less than 1 in 10 chance of survival.

So Harry's parents are fundraising in case he needs further treatment that's not available on the NHS.

Funds raised will go towards helping Harry and his family. If Harry no longer needs the funds or is in remission 5 years post the end of successful treatment, the funds will be used to support other children and families affected by neuroblastoma through our activities.



The fundraising target identified above combines the cost of treatment, the associated costs (e.g. travel and accommodation) as well as contingency for any unforeseen complications. For children with high-risk neuroblastoma, like Harry, the survival rate is much lower than other childhood cancers. Upon relapse, this rate reduces even further to less than one in ten.
